Look carefully at patterns found throughout the collections in painting and sculpture. Then create an artwork with a variety of patterns using rubbing plates and recycled materials.





## Materials:





- Paper
- Colored pencils
- Masking tape
- Recycled materials
- Color sticks

## Steps:



**Step 1:** Gather recycled materials that have interesting pattern potential. Use masking to create a frame for your paper.






**Step 2:** Place your recycled materials underneath your paper. Use color sticks or colored pencils to create rubbings of your patterns





**Step 3:** Stop here and enjoy a colorfully framed composition.



**Step 3:** (Or) Carefully remove the masking tape to reveal the clean edges you created.



**Step 5:** Enjoy your piece and think about the colors and textures you experimented with.
